2) Interactive communication

- a) Initiating
- b) Responding (see below)
- c) Hesitation
- d) Turn-taking

Coherence:

Discourse markers: okay, well, you know, I mean, right, actually, like, I think, so, cos, you see, I don't know:

- Initiating a turn
- Introducing new topic
- Ending a turn
- Finishing a topic

Responding:

Backchannels (carry-on signals, convergence tokens, non-minimal response tokens):

Verbal:

- Vocalisations (*mm*, *hm*)
- Single words (yeah, yes, really, absolutely)
- Cluster (yeah really, oh right, all right)
- Collocations/Idioms (I know, I see, oh my God)
- Tags (Did he?, Was it?)
- Affirmative echo (that's right)

Non-verbal:

- Nodding one's head
- Smiles
- Gesture
